Goddess "Mry.t" on Wooden Coffins

The goddess Mry.t appeared on a group of coffins. This study will prove the effective role of the goddess Mry.t in protecting the deceased with the help of a depiction of the goddess Mry.t on a group of coffins bearing the name and depiction of that goddess. These coffins date back to the beginning of the 25th Dynasty, extending to the Late Period. The goddess Mry.t appears on the lids of coffins and often depicted in a standing position with her hands raised alongside many different deities.

Introduction

Name of Mry.t

1- At the Old Kingdom:

Mry.t means real "singers", more precisely a "singing group", since there is probably a collective.¹ The process of divinization, which in the Old Kingdom is almost exclusively evident in mediator figures and is usually sparked at the funeral service,² can therefore also be followed quite precisely for a personification.



The oldest written mention of the word  to date can be found on the fragment of a diorite shell from the step pyramid, which, comes from the transition period from the 3rd to the 4th Dyn.³

2- At the Middle kingdom:

The spelling of the Old kingdom is retained, the determinative of the arm is sometimes omitted  and replaced by that of the seated woman, sometimes with special hair decorations ,  or replaced by egg ⁴,⁵ A notable variant in the Admonitions, which are available in a manuscript from the 19th dynasty, is the determinative of the eye  and, probably erroneously or associatively because of the "weaving", that of the piece of cloth .

3- At the New kingdom up to the late period:

All previously common spellings are still attested, and there are several examples of determining by eye ,⁷ ,⁸ ,⁹ and .¹⁰

4- At the Gre-Roman period:

The name is also rendered logographically, sometimes with standing figures of Mry.t, often with corresponding Upper or Lower Egyptian headdresses ,¹¹ sometimes in a sitting position ,¹² and occasionally with squatting ones without headdresses ,¹³ and the Determination by eye is still proven .¹⁴ Then we notice that The new

development comes from the throat ,¹⁵ the spellings in which Mry.t and (𓃥)piece of meat means the “throat” in ( + 𓃥) of a goddess are not specifically listed,¹⁶ can be found also The spelling ,¹⁷ also another various variants, as the double reed leaves ,¹⁸ with meaningless -w (𓃥) in ,¹⁹ and without a feminine ending as .²⁰ In papyrus records Mry.t is also determined with the standing man with his arm raised ²¹ It appears as a phonogram in Mry.ti “sky eyes” ,²² Mry.t “(moon) eye”  “who fills the anx-eye with life, the Mry.t-eye with alabaster...etc, fills the Mry.t-eye with what it loves”.²³

The Depiction of the goddess Mry.t:

(Doc.1)

Name: Berlin Sarcophagus no.11978: (fig.1)

Date: 25th dynasty

Gender: Male

Site: Der El-Bahri, Thebes

Current place: Berlin Museum

Description: At the right side outside, it is a rather poorly made box in the shape of a mummy, painted inside and out and covered with that characteristic, now yellow varnish. The great antiquity of the depictions on the coffin deserves special emphasis. Anyone who is familiar with the previously known Hb-sd images one will notice how much closer the coffin images are to the Abusir reliefs than the older depictions of Soleb or Bubastis.²⁴ the king

hurries with his crested ibis and oar to Osiris, who welcomes him and Mry.t with the words: (Welcome in peace!); also on the Lower side, which shows him running in the Hebsed race, the god speaks the welcome that was once characteristic of Mry.t in a modified form to the king and to Mry.t herself.

Description: The goddess Mry.t depicted on the right side of the lid of rectangular sarcophagus in the name of Ankh ef en khonsou I, she was surmounted by three stalks, offers

with both hands a large anx sign  in blue color; She has green flesh, long locks of hair unraveling down her back, a red strappy dress; behind her stands a large snake with green and blue beard. Re and Mry.t are standing on nb sign  in blue color.²⁶

Description On the outside of the lid in the right side, the goddess Mry.t depicted in standing position on a blue base, a goddess Mry.t in green flesh with raised arms; she wears a rob with

red braces, her elbow fall a red and blue strip; above her head  blue, and red flowers.²⁸

Date: Late period

Gender: Female

Site: Thebes

Current place: Cairo (Egypt), Egyptian Museum

Measurements: Length 2 m. 12 Cent., it's large. 0 m. 80 Cent. And it's total height 0 m. 83 Cent.

Description: On the outside of the lid the goddess Mry.t depicted in standing position, her arms outstretched with green flesh, and blue wig with unrolled locks ; She wears a red dress with straps, necklace and yellow periscelides.³⁰

Conclusion

The goddess Mry.t is depicted in standing position on the solar bark.

The goddess Mry.t did not appear alone, but many gods appeared alongside her, such as the gods Horus, Re, Harpocrates, and other gods.

Mry.t depicted in a green body at (CG. no. 41001, CG. no. 41008, and CG. no. 41018); she also wearing a dress with red braces at (CG. no. 41001, CG. no. 41008, and CG. no. 41018); the hair is with long lock on here back at (CG. no. 41001, and Berlin Sarcophagus no.11978); her head is surmounted by three stalks at (CG. no. 41001); above her head (blue, red flowers)  at (CG. no. 41008, and CG. no. 41018, and Berlin Sarcophagus no.11978); blue wig with rolled lock, surmounted by red , yellow necklace and anklet are depicted at (CG. no. 41018); from her elbow fall a red and blue strip at (CG. no. 41008); Double Mry.t are depicted at the right and left side from Osiris at Berlin Sarcophagus no.11978).

She is at Standing possition at (CG. no. 41018); standing upon blue nb at (CG. no. 41001, CG. no. 41008) and Berlin Sarcophagus no.11978 (lift Mry.t)) with Re at (CG. no. 41001);

Offering a blue grand ankh by here two hands at (CG. no. 41001); she up raised arms at (CG. no. 41008, and Berlin Sarcophagus no.11978); her arms are outstretched at (CG. no. 41018).

Goddess Mry.t assumes a significant cultural and ceremonial role as the embodiment of music, symbolizing joy, and actively participating in royal events. Her prominence extends to the funerary context, particularly evident in the iconography adorning sarcophagi from the Late Period.

In funerary scenes, Mry.t features prominently on the solar bark, accompanied by an array of diverse deities as they tow the celestial vessel. Within the context of these depictions, she consistently stands with arms elevated in the presence of the deceased. Atop her head, symbolic lotus or papyrus flowers lend an additional layer of spiritual significance, while her

attire, a tightly fitted robe adorned with braces, underscores the meticulous attention to detail characteristic of funerary iconography from this temporal epoch. This recurring portrayal underscores Mry.t's enduring importance in conveying not only musical and joyous attributes but also her integral role in the solemnity of funerary rites during the Late Period.




